## Month wise breakup of topics

### August 2017:

#### Allah

Sub topic: Allah's names (Asma e Ilahi) Rahman and Raheem.

- Allah Almighty is our Master, who has created us.
- Everything in this world happens by His orders.
- Allah is Rahman and Raheem.

#### Namaz

- Namaz is the second of the five pillars of Islam.
- It is an obligatory act (farz) upon all adult and able Muslims.
- Namaz has multiple health and fitness benefits.
- It teaches punctuality and equality.

#### Sample Questions:

- What is the meaning of Rehman and Raheem?
- What are some benefits of Namaz?

#### Activity:

Students will be taken to walk around the school to list down Allah's creations.

Worksheet will be provided to the students to draw some of Allah's creation.

### September 2017:

#### Getting up early

- Waking up early has multiple benefits.
- Muslims get up early and offer Fajr prayers.
- The most important meal of the day is breakfast, having a wholesome breakfast gives energy to stay active for the whole day.

#### Eid, a Muslim festival.

Sub topic: EidulFitr, EidulAzha

- There are two main festivals that Muslims celebrate every year - Eid-ul-Fitr and Eid-ul-Azha.
- Muslims fast in the month of Ramazan and upon the sight of the new moon they celebrate Eid-ul-Fitr on the first of Shawwal.
- Muslims offer special Eid Prayers on the morning of both Eids to thank Allah for all His blessings.
- Muslims should not forget those who are poor, needy and sick in their happiness.
- Eid-ul-Azha is celebrated on 10<sup>th</sup> Zilhajj in remembrance of the great sacrifice of Hazrat Ibrahim (AS) and his son Hazrat Ismail (AS).
- The sacrificial meat is distributed to relatives and needy.

#### Sample Questions:

- List some items which can be healthy for breakfast.
- What do you think you can share with others that will give you happiness?

**Activity:**

Students will find out how cousins/family/friends in Muslims communities living abroad celebrate their Eid.

**October 2017:****Generosity:**

- Generosity is an important virtue ordered by Allah.
- The word generous means 'kind'.
- Our dear Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) was very generous and taught us to be the same.
- There are many who do not have what we have, so we should be generous and sharing.
- Abdul Sattar Edhi is one of the most famous social workers respected not only in Pakistan but all over the world – his generosity is known throughout the world.
- The most truly generous persons are those who perform charity silently without hope of praise or reward.

**Sample Questions:**

- Who is Abdul Sattar Edhi? What did he do with the money that his mother gave him to spend?
- What does it mean to be generous?

**Activity:**

Students will bring a little extra lunch and share with everyone in class.

**November 2017: Revision****December 2017: Mid-year Examinations****January 2018:****The Prophets**

- Allah sent His messages and guidance through his Prophets.
- Hazrat Adam (AS) was the first man and Prophet of Allah.
- Hazrat Muhammad (PBUH) is the last and final Prophet of Allah.
- All Prophets were very noble and righteous men.

**Good Muslims**

- A good human being always keep promises, truthful, obedient, polite and honest etc.
- We should be helpful to everyone.
- It always feels good to be nice and help someone.

**Sample Questions:**

- Name the four prophets with their books.
- List some qualities of a good human being.

**Activity:**

Students will be asked to share their experience about the hospitality they may have experienced when traveling to other parts of Pakistan, or abroad.

**February 2018:****Mosque**

- A Mosque is a house of worship for Muslim with at least one 'minaret', 'mehrab' and 'gumbud' and a prayer hall where Muslims gather for prayer.
- The first mosque in the world is the area around the Ka'aba in Mecca, now known as the Masjid al-Haram.
- There are many beautiful mosques all around the world.

**Sample Questions:**

- Name the first mosque built by the Holy prophet (PBUH).
- List some of the features that are commonly present in a Mosque.

**Activity:**

Teacher will show multiple pictures of beautiful mosques; international and national. Students will identify features and talk about the architectural beauty.

**March 2018:****Kindness**

Sub topic: Be kind to parents and others.

- Always be very kind, obedient, helpful and polite to parents.
- It is very important to be kind to everyone.
- One small, thoughtful gesture can make someone else's day.
- Everyone likes a kind and gentle person to be his/her friend.

**Guest**

- Guests are a blessing from Allah.
- They bring happiness and love to our home.
- We should treat our guests with love and respect.

**Sample Question:**

- List some ways in which you should be kind to newly admitted student in your class.
- Why are guests a blessing from Allah?

**Activity:**

Students will engage in role play for showing good manners towards guests.
