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Month wise breakup of topics

August 2017:

Allah

Sub topic: Allah's names (Al-Wudood, Al-Ghafoor, Al-Mujeeb, Al-Hakeem)

- Allah is our Lord and Master we must obey Him.
- He has provided us with all that we need.
- The best way to thank Him is to obey Him, to be good to His people and to all that He has created.

The Holy Quran

- The Holy Quran is the last and final book sent by Allah.
- It is a complete guide for all people of the world for all times.
- First five verses of Surah Alaq teach us the importance of seeking education.
- Proper recitation of the Quran is called Qirat and those who recite it are called Qaris.
- Arabic writing of the Quran is often used in Art as calligraphy.

Sample Questions:

- Plants and pets are Allah's creations. List some ways in which you can take care of them.
- Why has Quran been translated in most of the written languages of the world?

Activity:

Students will discuss meanings of studied Asma-e-Ilahi and look for those values in themselves and their family members; bring a positive change in life.

September 2017:

Taharat

- Arabic word for cleanliness and purity is Taharat.
- Wuzu and Ghysl (bath) are both ways of keeping ourselves clean.
- Children should take care of their personal hygiene which includes cleaning of hair, teeth and nails; all clothes should also be clean.
- Clean people remain healthy and happy.

Good Manners

Sub topics: Saying Thank you, Saying Sorry, Asking Permission.

- Allah loves those who thank Him and blesses them with more.
- If we do something wrong we must apologize and try our best not to repeat the mistake again.
- Allah is Al-Ghafoor; He forgives those who are sorry when they make a mistake.
- It is good to take permission from parents or elders before doing something.

Sample Questions:

- Untidy places are a good shelter for germs, flies and mosquitoes. How can we keep our surroundings clean?
- What is the best thing to do when we make a mistake?

Activity: Role play – students perform a role play on good manners.

October 2017:**Namaz**

- Namaz is obligatory for all Muslims five times a day.
- Namaz has multiple health benefits.
- Namaz has many steps included in its completion.

Speaking the truth

- Since childhood, Prophet Mohammed (PBUH) spoke the truth so he was called 'Sadiq' which means truthful.
- A truthful person is always respected by all.
- Syed Abdul Qadir Jilani is a great Islamic scholar and is respected all over the world for his knowledge and truthfulness – an example of 'Sadiq'.

Sample Questions:

- How does each step performed in prayer helps in maintaining physical fitness?
- What lesson do you learn from the story of Syed Abdul Qadir Jilani?

Activity:

Students will engage in a class discussion on the importance of speaking the truth.
A character development story will be shared with the class.

- Fasting (Roza) in the month of Ramzan is an important part of our faith.
- Roza is the third of the five pillars of Islam and obligatory for all adult and able Muslims.
- Fasting allows the human digestive system to take rest.
- Fasting has many health benefits.

Respect for Parents

- Parents are a blessing from Allah.
- Parents look after children with love and care; they sacrifice their own needs to give the best to their children.
- We must always do as they say and take care of them.

Sample Question:

- Why does Ramzan fall in a different month each year?
- What must we do if our parents reach old age?

Activity:

Students will find out different hours of Roza from cousins, relatives and friends from Muslim communities living in other countries.

February 2018:**The Holy Prophet (PBUH)**

- Prophet Mohammed (PBUH) is the last and final Messenger of Allah.
- There were many clear signs of his Prophethood since childhood.
- The whole life of our Prophet (PBUH) is the best example for us to follow.
- He is the best guide and teacher for the people of the whole world for all times.

Respect for teachers and books

- According to the teachings of the first verse of the Surah Alaq of the Quran, seeking knowledge is obligatory on all Muslims.
- Teachers deserve our respect and obedience because they give us knowledge.
- Books provide knowledge; we must respect books and make sure they are kept properly.

Sample Question:

- List the signs that Bahira observed which indicated the blessed future of Muhammad (PBUH).
- Describe some ways in which we can we look after books.

Activity:

Students will clean their bags and place their books and copies in an organized manner.

March 2018:**Islamic Calendar**

- Islamic calendar is a lunar calendar based on the cycle of the moon.
- It was started after the migration of the Prophet (PBUH) from Mecca to Medina by the suggestion of Hazrat Umer Farooq (RA).
- The first month of the Hijri calendar is Muharram and the last is Zil-Hajj.

Respect for elders

- Being a good human being it is our duty to respect all our elders.
- All our fellow human beings deserve our respect.

Sample Question:

- How many days are there in a Hijri calendar?
- How did the Prophet (PBUH) treat his wet nurse Hazrat Halima Sadia and his mother's maid Umme Aimen?

Activity:

Students will practice calligraphy and write out a name of any month from the Hijri calendar.
