Rightly Guided Caliphs-Hazrat Uthman (RA)

- Hazrat Uthman (RA) was elected by all companions to be the most suitable candidate for the caliphate after Hazrat Umer (RA).
- Hazrat Uthman (RA) included Libya, Tunisia, Algeria, Morocco and the Island of Cyprus to the Islamic Empire.
- His services regarding compilation of the Quran, establishment of navy and extension of Masjid e Nabvi is highly appreciated.

Rightly Guided Caliphs-Hazrat Ali (RA)

- Hazrat Ali was elected as the fourth Caliph.
- At the time of his appointment, the Islamic Empire was in the most confused situation due to the tragic circumstances which prevailed.
- Governors of the respective provinces were ordered to step down and new appointments were made to their vacant seats.

Important Personalities during the lifetime of Holy Prophet's (PBUH)

- Prominent companions were those true followers of the Holy Prophet (PBUH) who remained steadfast in accepting Islam, and sacrificed a lot for the sake of Allah.
- They were matchless in their love, devotion and commitment to the Holy Prophet (PBUH).

Rightly Guided Caliph's relation with other states

- The Rightly Guided Caliphs strictly followed the policies of the Holy Prophet (PBUH) for their dealings with other states.
- They worked on the policy of friendship, justice, peace and equality.

Holy Prophet's (PBUH) relation with other states

- The foreign relations policy of the Holy Prophet (PBUH) with other states was based on justice and equality.
- He worked on the policy of friendship, goodwill and cooperation.
- He always fulfilled agreements and pacts made with other states.

Rights of non-Muslims

- The Holy Prophet (PBUH) and all the companions followed the same policy for the non-Muslims living within the Muslim country.
- They were called 'Dhimmis' - The people of the Covenant.
- They were allowed to renovate, build and expand their houses of worship.
